## Application for Prefix/Suffix

A GVHS member may register a prefix for a fee of \$80. (This is a one-time). Such prefixes are to be restricted to and required of every foal recorded by that breeder.

- 1. Breeders may have only one active prefix / suffix, only the owner of the prefix / suffix can use it.
- 2. Breeder must be a GVHS member to register a prefix / suffix.
- 3. The breeder is considered to be the person who owns the dam at time of service.
- 4. Animals sold in-utero must use the prefix of the owner of the dam unless imported in-utero.
- 5. The owner of a prefix / suffix may extend the use of it to members of his/her immediate family.
- 6. In instances of herd or dispersal sales where all or a large part of a herd is sold to one purchaser, the herd prefix /suffix may be transferred to the new owner(s) upon written permission of the breeder and approval of the Board.
- 7. Owner's right to prefix / suffix shall be lost by 20 consecutive years of non-use.
- 8. Prefix / suffix must be at least two letters, and included with the name of the horse cannot exceed the 40 letter limit for naming.
- 9. A suffix may be added to the name of a purchased animal, a prefix is only used on a horse bred by the owner of the prefix.
- 10. Each prefix / suffix must be unique from all others in use within the GVHS worldwide.
